You will be supported to explore a range of sensory equipment with your baby and have a chance to connect with other new and first-time parents. **First words together**—Babies communicate long before they start to talk, through gestures, showing and giving objects, pointing, and vocalising. Sharing books and interacting through books from when babies are very young supports communication and language development.
