### Health & Wellbeing Tip—Make your own bird nest

The desire to lay eggs and raise young is innate for every bird. Despite this need, not all birds build a nest from scratch – some take advantage of existing holes in trees, some create simple scrapes in the ground and some birds, like the Cuckoo, lay their eggs in other birds nests to save them the job of looking after their young!

However, most birds work tirelessly each spring to build a nest using only their beaks. Take some time to consider these amazing structures – the importance of their design and construction for the job they do, the various sizes, shapes and locations chosen. Create your own using natural materials - harder than you think!

### **Ofsted Celebrations**

Last week the children embarked on an exciting adventure to Wilson Atkinson Farm. The trip was an incredible opportunity for the children to learn about sustainable farming practices and interact with lambs, cows and goats. The children travelled on mini buses provided by 'Community First' as a celebration for our Ofsted rating being 'Good'. All of the children were respectful, engaged and asked lots of interesting questions.







Everyone got a chance to meet adorable new born lambs and learn about their lifecycle including a group of triplets with their mummy that were just hours old!

During the visit, the children got to see first-hand how cows are cared for and the essential role they play in sustainable agriculture. They learned about meat production and how these animals contribute to our food supply.





The trip wouldn't be complete without meeting the friendly goats! The children were fascinated by the goat's curious nature and enjoyed learning facts about their life on the farm.

Hopefully this immersive trip has been one that creates memorable experiences and interests children into where their food comes from.

### **Contact Details**

It is vital we have up to date information for your child.

For your information you are able to update details i.e. telephone/mobile no's, email addresses, any other contacts, doctors surgery & more etc on Arbor, this will be subject to approval from our admin team. Please do take a look at your child's Arbor account and make any necessary changes.

If you are unable to make changes please let the school office know as soon as possible by email so we can update your child's records accordingly. Thank you.

### Absences/Medical Appointments – Absence Line

If your child is unwell please ensure you leave a message on the absence line, stating your child's name, class and reason for absence **by 9am**.

We do require you to leave a message on the absence line <u>everyday</u> your child is absent. We check for absences daily and if we have not received a message by 9am, we have to assume your child is missing and a telephone call will be made to enquire the reason for their absence. You can leave a message at anytime as the absence line is available 24hrs a day.

If your child has a medical appointment and will not be in for registration, you can also leave a message on the absence line. Please also include whether your child will be bringing a packed lunch or would need a school dinner ordered. If a school dinner is required, please state their choice of red or green.

We also require evidence of all medical appointments i.e. an appointment card, medical letter, email or a screenshot of a text message, for our records. Thank you.

### Outside Learning Environment Development Update




